

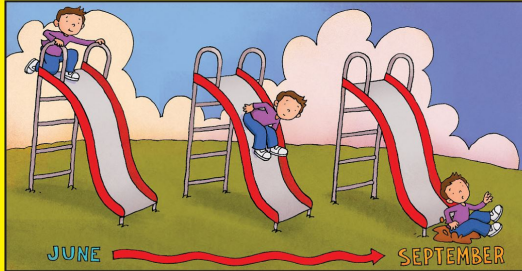


# READ ... ALL SUMMER LONG!

## 2022 Summer Reading

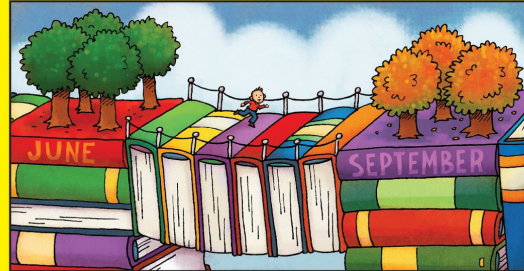


### WHY SUMMER READING IS IMPORTANT



#### PREVENT "SUMMER SLIDE"

Children who don't read during the summer can lose up to two months of learning by the time they return to school in the fall.



#### BUILD A BRIDGE

Children who participate in Summer Reading Programs and read a minimum of six books over the summer score higher in reading AND math when they return to school.

Summer is a time to relax, enjoy the outdoors, spend time with family and friends, and of course, **read!** Summer reading helps to minimize the summer "slide" and keeps students on track for success in the fall. There is no list of "required" books to read. Rather, we want students to continue to discover their reading identities and build their reading stamina. Research shows that this happens when students read books of their choosing. Below are ways for students to grow as readers over the summer!



#### Summer Reading Bingo

On the next page is the **Summer Reading Bingo** form. Students who complete **ANY** five squares and return their sheets will be invited to a reading celebration to be held in September. Turn in your completed sheets at the Middleborough Public Library and they will be delivered to your school in the fall. Misplace the bingo form? No worries! You can find a new form on the school website under summer reading and printed copies will be available at the Middleborough Public Library.

#### Read Beyond the Beaten Path: Middleborough Public Library Summer Reading Program!

We encourage students to participate in the summer reading program sponsored by the Middleborough Public Library from June 18 - August 18. More information can be found on the library's website, [www.midlib.org](http://www.midlib.org), or at the library. Any reading or related activities done for the library program can also be used to complete squares on the bingo sheet! Participate online or using the free Beanstack tracker app. Students can find and share book recommendations, earn virtual badges for reading and completing activities, and enter drawings for weekly ice cream prizes as well as 5 grand prizes given away at the end of the program. **Students who sign up and read for the summer reading program at the library will also be invited to the reading celebration at school in September. Read once and do both!**
























#### Summer Book Swap
