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Adult Summer Reading Program 2021

Activity Descriptions

Go to www.midlib.org to register, participate, and earn badges for chances to earn one of five prizes or the grand prize!

1. Folded Book Animal Craft Project

We have many, many donated books that have become orphaned (think Island of Misfit Toys in the Rudolph Christmas special) and we'd like to give them new life this summer. Sign up for a craft kit to make a Folded Book Animal; each kit will include instructions, and one book. Once your project is completed, post a picture of it on our Facebook page or send it to lfox@sailsinc.org and you'll earn one chance for a prize.

2. Tails & Tales

Complete any **two of the four** "Tails & Tales" activities described below and earn one chance for a prize. They are: 1. Read your child, grandchild or another child in your life a story that features a whale. 2. Describe what it was like when you were a child to have a story read to YOU. 3. Tell us about your favorite book as a child and what made it special to you. 4. Tell us about a favorite book you've read to your child, grandchild or another child in your life.

3. Books, Authors and More

Complete any **two of the four** "Books, Authors and More" activities described below and earn one chance for a prize. They are: 1. Tell us where and why you get recommendations on what to read next. From a friend/family member? A book review publication/website? Goodreads? Amazon? Your favorite librarian? © 2. Read an author's biography or autobiography. Tell us who you chose, and why. 3. Watch an author reading his/her work on YouTube. Tell us what/who you watched and why. 4. Find a favorite author on Facebook or Instagram, and like/follow their page. Tell us who you chose, and why.

4. Whale-Watching Activity

We live close to Plymouth and Cape Cod, both popular whale-watching ports of departure. Have you always wanted to go on a whale-watching tour and never done it? Make this the summer you make it happen. Schedule a tour and tell us a little bit about your experience. If you email a picture of yourself on the trip you'll get an extra chance for a prize.

If you've already had the good fortune to take a whale-watching trip, tell us about it. Again, extra points if you have a photo from your trip you can email.

5. Novelist Activity

Enter **the names of your original author and two of the read-alike author names** you find on Novelist to earn one chance for a prize.

6. Kahoot Online Trivia Activity

What the heck is a Kahoot, you ask? Kahoot is a trivia game that can be played by lots of people at once, as long as they receive an invitation. They can be live or spread out over several days or weeks.

We've prepared a Tails & Tales Kahoot on Fun Animal Facts, and will have spots for up to 50 devices (desktop computers, laptops and mobile devices). There's no limit on the number of people you can invite to play with you gathered around each device.

First, request an invite to play the Kahoot from Reference/Adult Services Librarian Libby Fox (<u>lfox@sailsinc.org</u>). After you've completed the game, email her your player name so she can give you credit for this activity. You'll earn one chance for a prize. **You MUST complete this activity by July 18 when the game closes.**

7. Get to Know the Library Website

This activity invites you to learn more about features of our website that you may not be familiar with. Look for the answers to these questions and enter them to earn this badge. You must provide all answers to all three questions to complete this activity for full credit and to earn one chance for a prize.

a. Log onto Consumer Reports through our website (you'll need your library card number). Spend time looking through the site and tell us one thing you learned about a product you're interested in buying that you didn't know before.

- b. Find the link for the *Middleborough Antiquarian*. Find the November 1983 issue and tell us which two musicians are featured under the article headline, "Talented Musicians of Middleboro."
- c. Find the link for "Library Newsletter" and tell us how many issues we published during the summer of 2020 -- including June, July and August.

- b. Who was the vice principal of Middleborough High School in 1964? (Hint: look at the online yearbook collection.)
- c. What was the maiden name of Mary Hannah Sipolin's mother? (Hint: look in the online Vital Records.)

11. Niche Academy

Look around the site, choose something interesting that you'd like to learn more about and watch one or more videos about it. When you're finished, tell us a little about your topic and something new that you learned. You'll earn one chance for a prize.

14. Family Staycation/Vacation Plans

15.OverDrive/Libby App Usage

Check out a book (it can be an audio book or an e-book) using OverDrive through the Library's website at www.midlib.org or through the Libby app, which can be downloaded from your device's App Store. List the title of the book and a one- to two-sentence description of it to receive one prize chance for this activity.



16. Potpourri of Library Activities

Complete **two of the four** potpourri of Library activities and earn one chance for one prize. They are: 1. Write a review of a book about an animal (fiction or nonfiction) and email it to lfox@sailsinc.org. (With your permission, we may use it on our Facebook page.) 2. Stream a movie/TV series about animals (real or fictional) from OverDrive and let us know which one you watched and whether or not you'd recommend it to someone else. 3. Encourage a non-Library user you know to sign up online for a Library card and let us know if he/she did. 4. Check out a bird-watching guide from our collection and let us know what birds you spotted using your guide.

17. Adult Coloring Sheets

Request the owl, crow and hummingbird adult coloring sheets from Libby Fox, lfox@sailsinc.org, or pick them up at the Library. Complete all three sheets and drop them off or email them back to Libby. Let us know if you give us permission to display your artwork in the Library, and if so, with or without your name. When we've received all three, you'll earn one chance for a prize.

18. Social Media Activity
